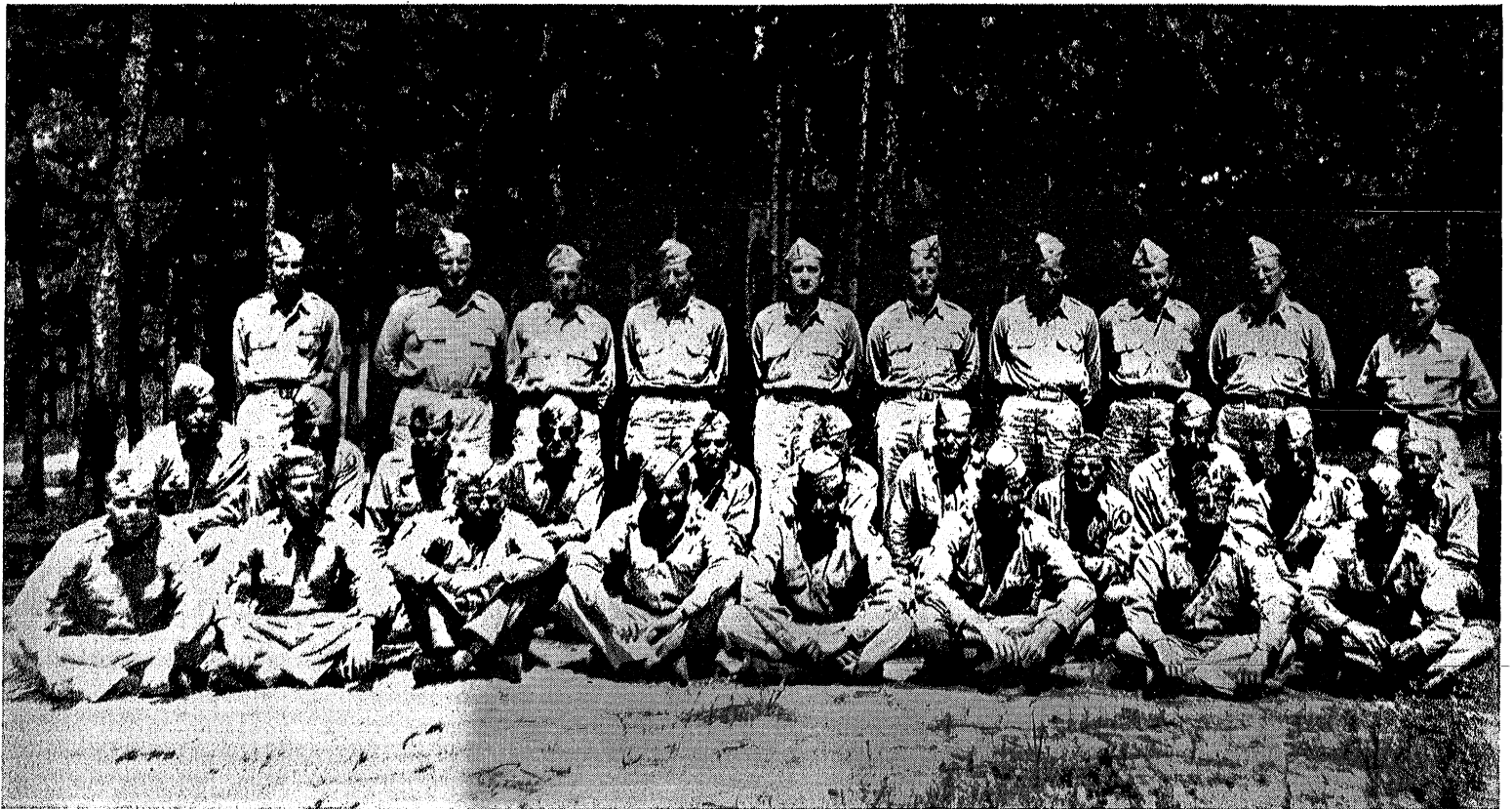

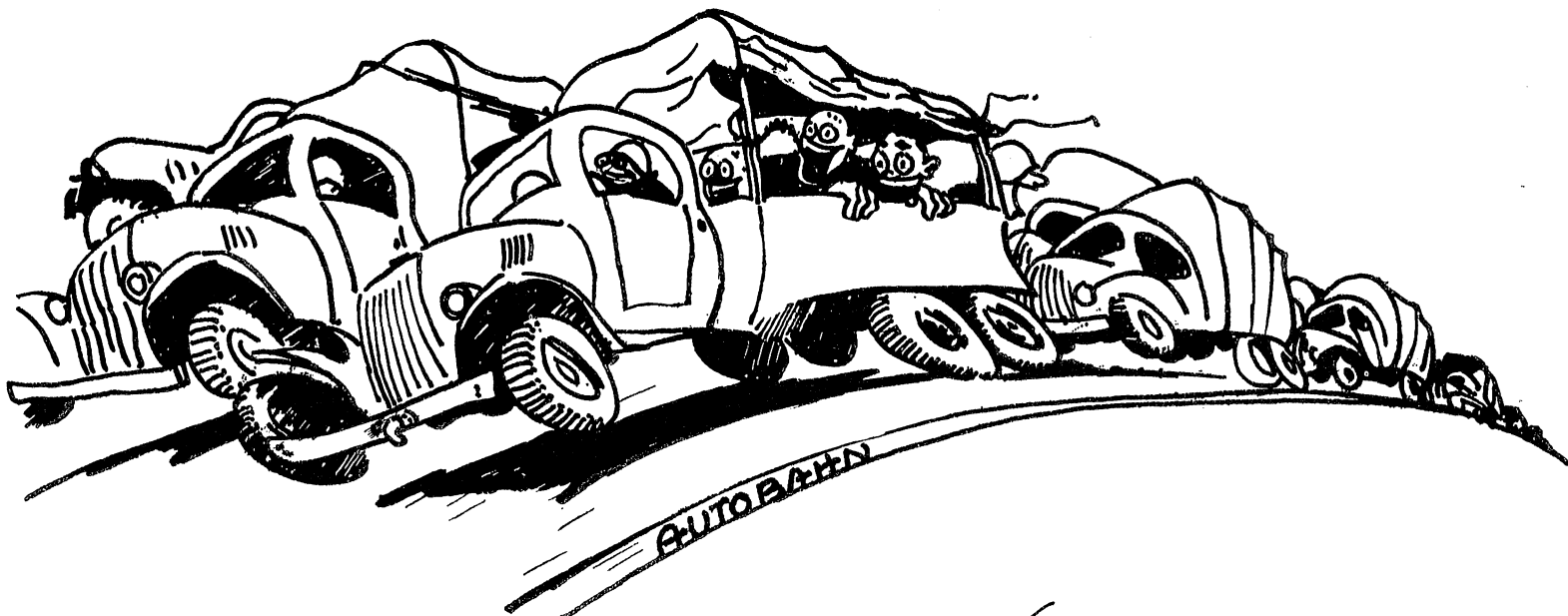
ACTIVATION TRAINING



To begin with, let us say we were not the best engineer battalion in the United States Army, but with all modesty, none were better. We trained long and hard in preparation for that day we would come to grips with the enemy. We learned how to fight as infantry riflemen in the earlier days for that is one of our jobs in an emergency. Reinforce the doughboy! Then we settled down to the strenuous task of becoming fighting engineers. Yes, the Southland echoed to the tramp of our feet and the rolling wheels of our trucks! We were fast becoming an important cog in the greatest fighting machine ever developed.

We activated at Camp McCain, Miss., on Dec. 15, 1942. McCain—that is where you freeze in the winter and roast in the summer! I am quite sure none will forget this birthplace for many, many years to come. Despite the drudgery at McCain's training grounds, there were humorous incidents. For instance, remember the Company's mascot, that

old Billy Goat? He drank beer like Borek, and ate anything from tin cans to cigarettes. They finally had to redeploy him for he was caught down at the motor pool devouring B Company's vehicles! After the ordeal at Camp McCain, we engaged in the Tennessee maneuvers which began Dec. 2, 1943, and lasted until Jan. 19, 1944. What battle background we received here! No one was intentionally trying to kill us, but it was the next thing to it. We came out of this phase of training a bit wiser and tougher. Fort Jackson, S. C. received us with open arms on 21st day of January, 1944. It was here we received our advance engineer training. Long days and longer nights passed through the hour-glass of time, until we were finally declared ready for combat. Yes, our months of freezing, sweating, working, thinking, and bitching were about to pay off! Were we dreaming? Not for one moment, for we were on the train headed for the P.O.E. at Camp Kilmer, N. J., Oct. 14, 1944. After a short period of processing, we boarded the Louis Pasteur Nov. 3, 1944 headed for Europe via England. Nov. 14, 1944 found us disembarking at Liverpool, England, from where we proceeded to Tattenhall for the gathering together of our equipment. We left England for the continent on Nov. 28, 1944, crossing the channel in L.S.T's. We finally reached France on Nov. 30, 1944, where we quickly moved toward our future battlegrounds in Northern France. We had several reasons other than meeting the Jerries for moving with speed across France. Those decorations in front of the kitchen doors didn't encourage our appetites, if you know what I mean!

C O M B A T H I S T O R Y

Our combat record is something to be proud of in anybody's company. Mistakes? Yes, we made plenty of them. However, every mistake was another blow struck at the enemy for we were gaining valuable experience with each error in our judgment. Our victory in the end proved our learning ability. This, no one can deny.

Metz, France was where we were baptized to fire. Snipers were plentiful, and four enemy forts on the outskirts of the city had to be taken. We were there but a few days, but in that time two of the forts had capitulated and the sniping was nil.

One interesting side note about Metz is that it had never before been taken in battle. It was known as the fortress city." It breached the Maginot Line, and was so constructed as to add to the defense in that sector. The city's inhabitants were neither French or German. They were a mixture of both! Trusting a sidewalk citizen was like committing suicide. I don't believe we will ever forget the work we did making that Nazi school into our living quarters only to move out the next day. Remember the church in the rear where the Germans kept their women of questionable morals? Ahem!

We all shiver at the thought of the next two

words, Saar Basin! Yes, we relieved the 26th Division in this bloody hole, and it was here that we knew what combat really was. Our battalion was assigned to infantry regiments in the form of combat teams. A Company was part of the 345th combat team, B company was attached to the 346th and C Company was assigned to the 347th combat team. Our own H&S company took care of our supplies and administrative work which are very important to the functioning of front-line activities. We were now well organized teams and ready for the fight ahead.

SAAR BASIN

Nothing in print could ever describe this field of battle realistically. It was a terrific uphill battle with the advantage of observation and defense all with the Krauts. According to news reports, opposition was light; but we knew better. We never took a French village without first calling on our supporting artillery to lay down a barrage. Yes, the Jerries learned to respect our "Whispering Death." We may have destroyed a few houses and saved just one American life, but it was a cheap price to pay. Our casualties, that is, those of the combat teams, were very high. However, the work we did in support of the doughboys will never be

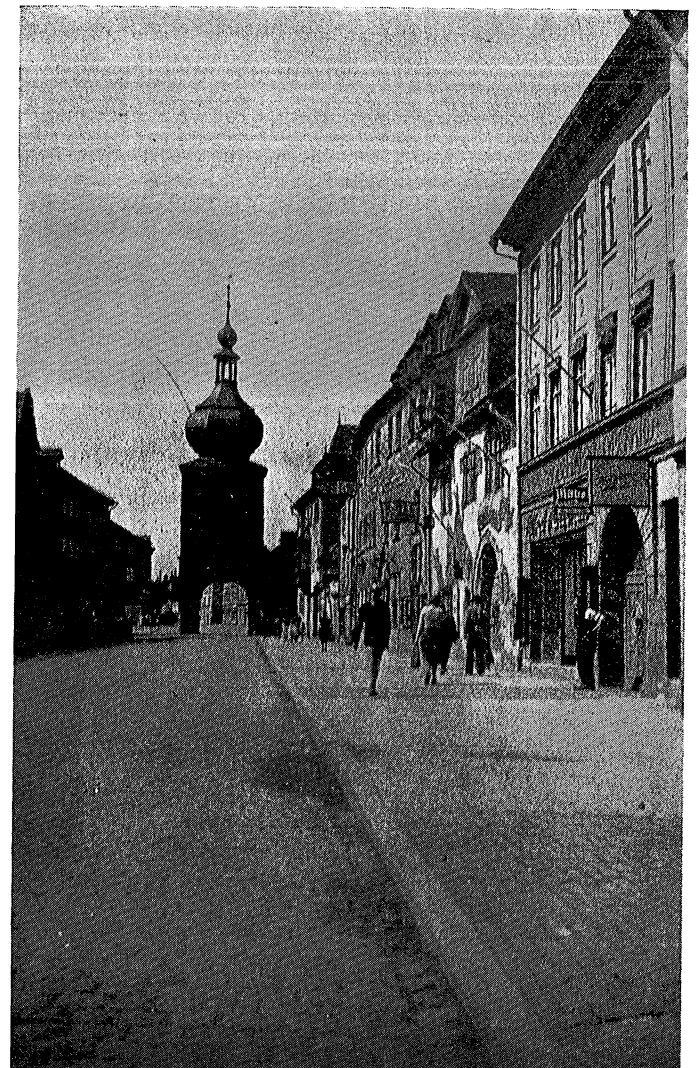
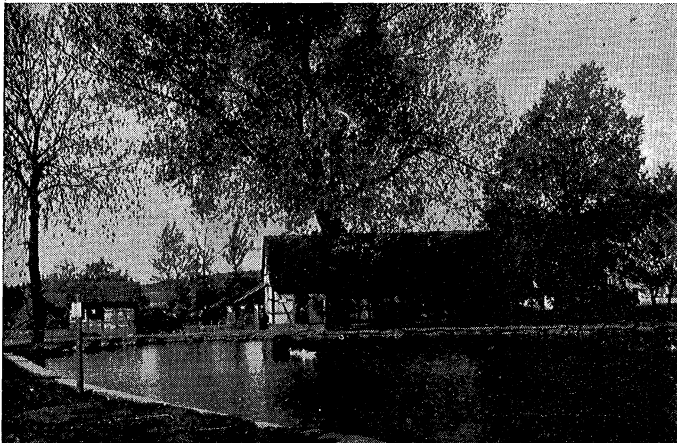
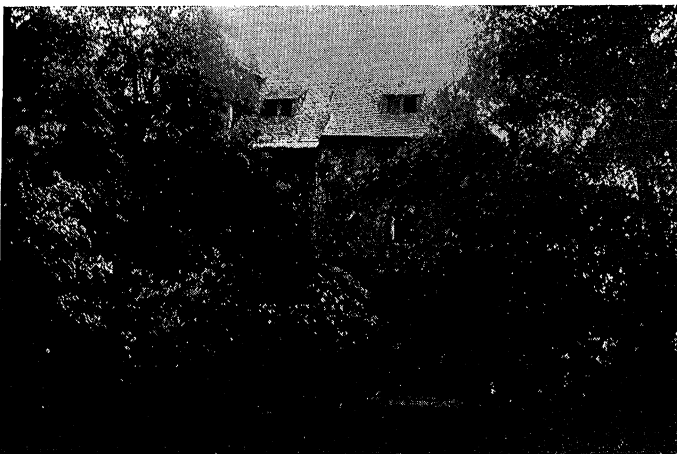


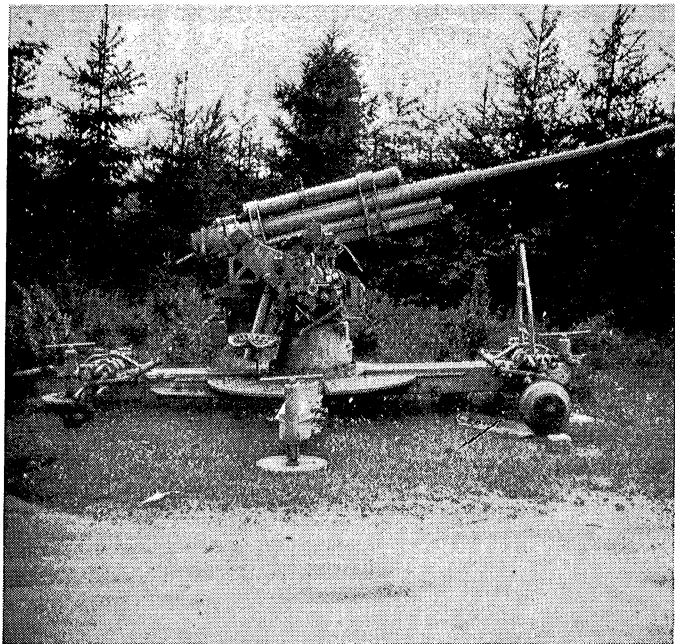

forgotten. Mine fields were laid in no-man's-land under enemy fire, German mine fields were removed under their very noses. Bridges were built under direct observation so that supplies could get to our buddies, the infantry. Roads were repaired and cleared of obstacles. New roads were constructed

through the mud and forests. We had plenty to do, and we did the job! Before we knew it, we were on the sacred soil of the "Fatherland." One couldn't help but notice the immediate difference in the peo-

ple and the country. The Germans here had more and better clothes, more food, and nicer homes than the French we had just left. Yes, they were cleaner too. It was only natural that they should be, for they were the victors at this time. Victors? That's for sure! For we learned shortly after we were taken from this area that they had retaken this ground that we fought so laboriously for. We were never allowed to finish our advance in this sector for we were desperately needed elsewhere, the Belgium Bulge!

BATTLE OF THE ARDENNES

When we arrived in Belgium, the Germans had advanced sixty miles through our lines, and were

driving with all the fury their crack troops and panzers could muster. Our doughs not only stopped them, but counterattacked with success. Mines and booby traps were everywhere. Roads were blocked by booby obstacles. We went to work with the efficiency we had by now mastered. The infantry was never slowed down once by German-made obstacles. We cleared them with lightening speed, winning a commendation from the infantry commanders for

the fine work we did. This work was accomplished in four to five feet of snow and freezing weather. Our tenacious attitude for doing the job, despite the odds, broke the enemies defense, and the battle was won. Well, our training had proven itself. We beat the best the Germans had under extremely bad weather conditions. The cost in lives was great,

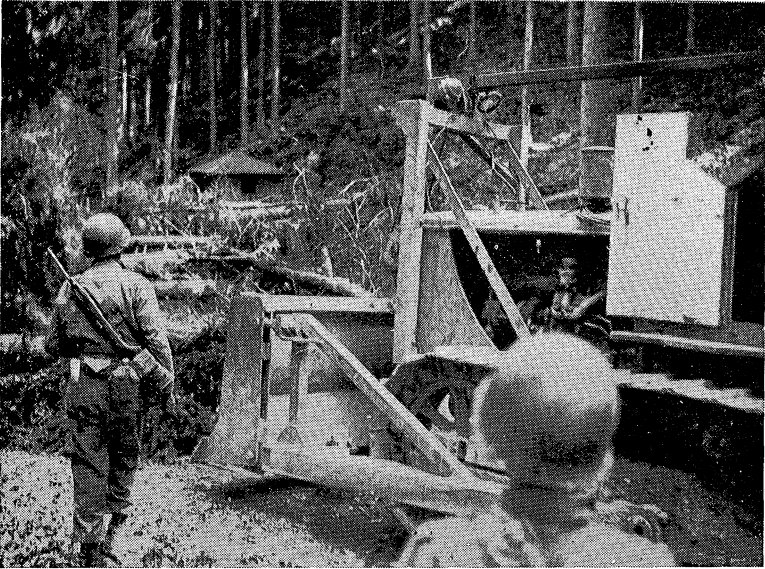
and many old faces disappeared in the snows of Belgium.

THE BATTLE OF THE RHINE

At the conclusion of the Bulge, we were facing the Siegfried line, first at Luxembourg, then at the German-Belgium border. It was at the latter that

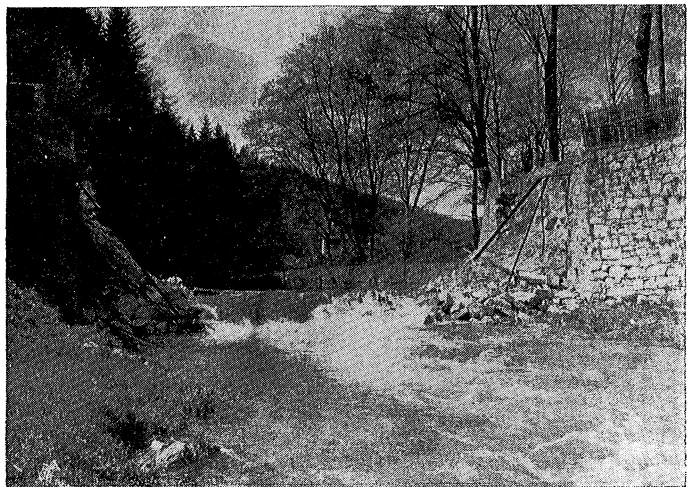




we cracked the famous Hitler line of defense, and raced toward the Rhine. We are modest when we say we "cracked" the Siegfried. Hitler's pill boxes were nothing but overturned bits of rubble when we completed our demolition work. Under-statement enough, considering we placed a ton of ex-

plosives inside some of the tougher ones. This was an engineers' battle, for there were blown bridges, road obstacles, mines by the thousands, and demolition work. We knew the big push was on, and we worked like beavers to keep our tankers and infantry in the race to the Rhine. This we accomplished

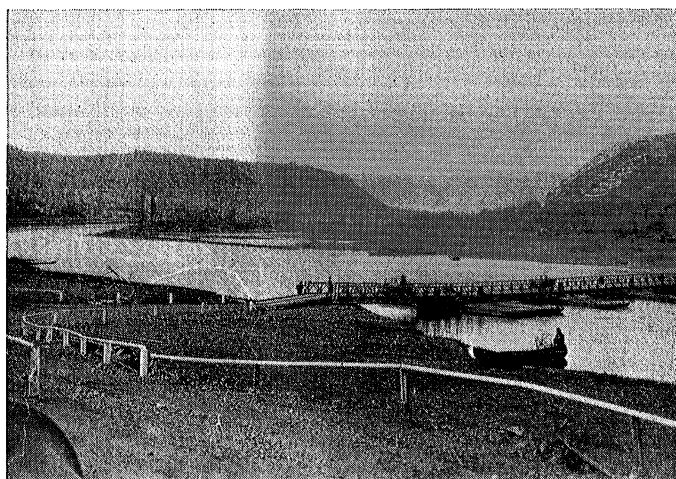

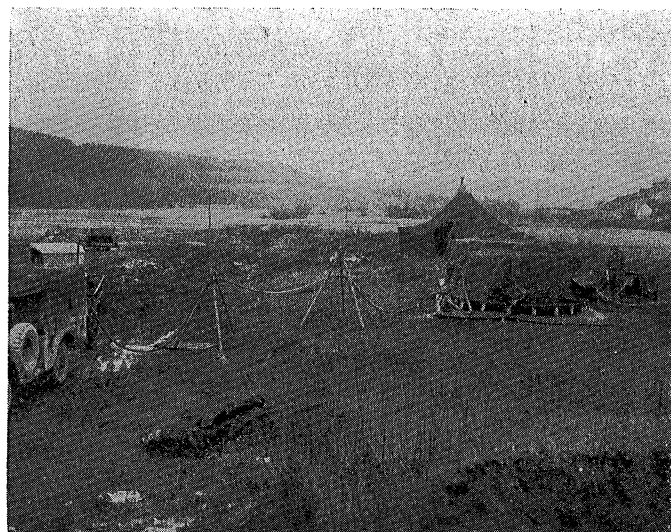
in record time. Before we realized our own efforts, there we were confronted with getting our doughs and tanks across the last great barrier, the famous Rhine! When we think of the Rhine, we automatically think of Coblenz. Coblenz, that is the city of

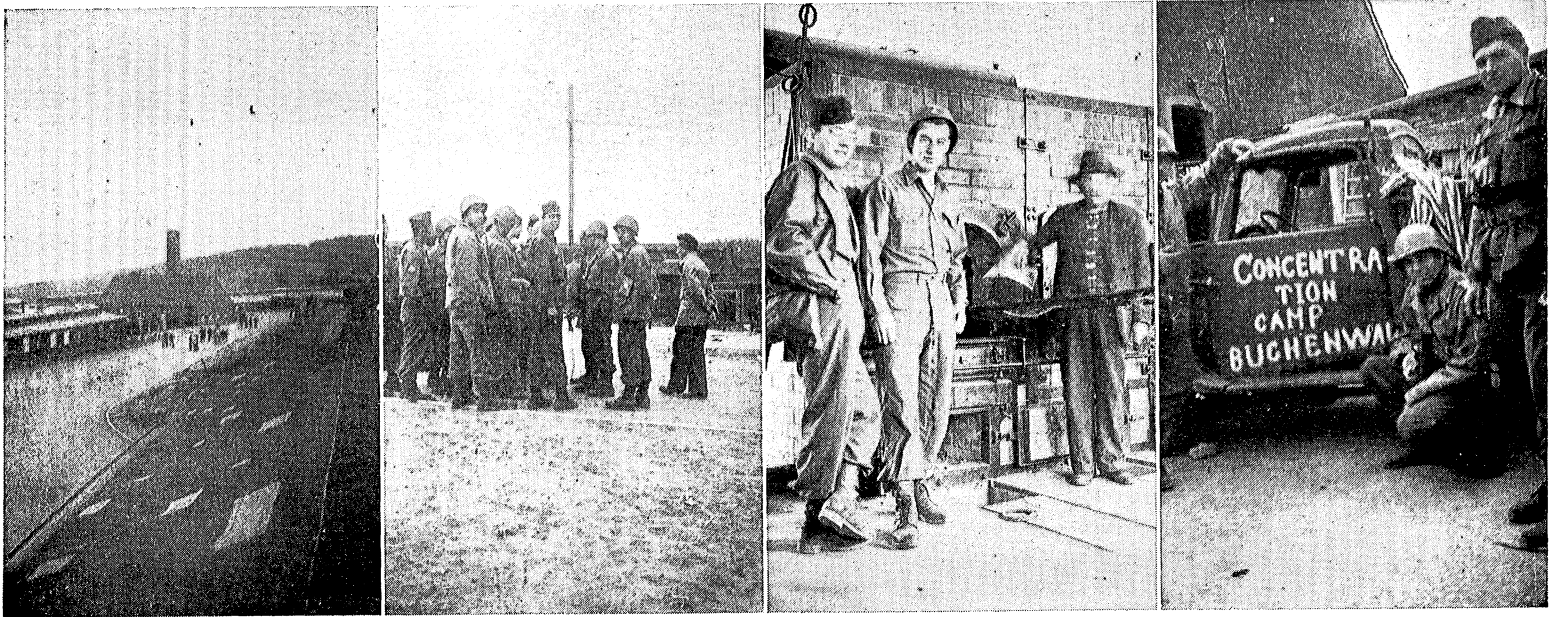
Moselle River Crossing, Germany; Coblenz was next.



looted champagne and stuff! Taking Coblenz was a battle in itself. It was here that the Golden Acorn won world fame for taking such a prize in a short length of time. It was from this famous city that we sent out engineer and infantry patrols to feel out the enemy strength and defensive positions on the opposite bank. Remember the spine-tickling feeling rowing across that hugh span of water into Der Fuerher's own backyard? Some patrols were discovered, but we got the necessary information from these jaunts. A few nights later we made the assault with unexpected light casualties. The Siegfried was ours, and now we controlled the largest river in Germany. We were ready for the last push—across the Fatherland itself.

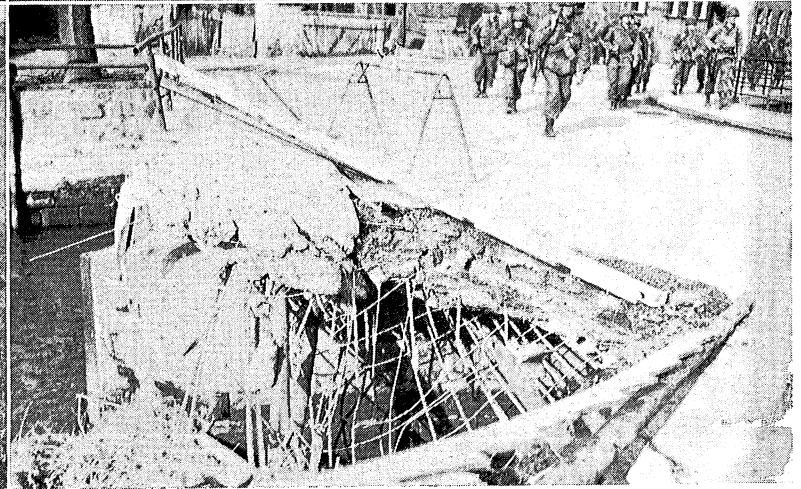
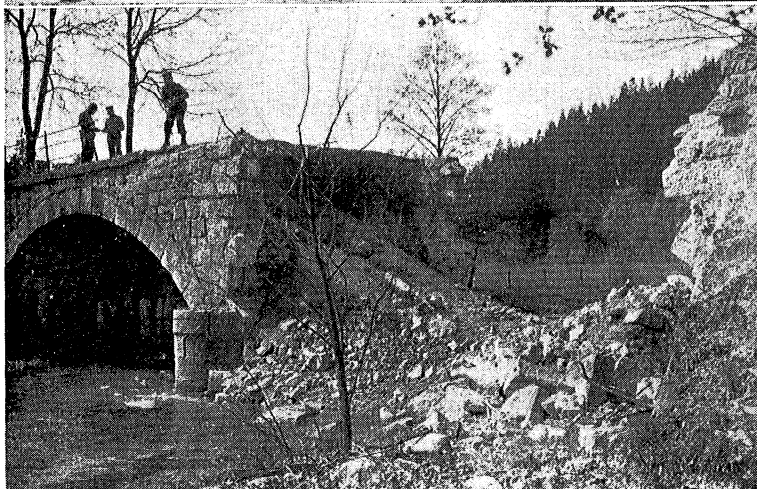
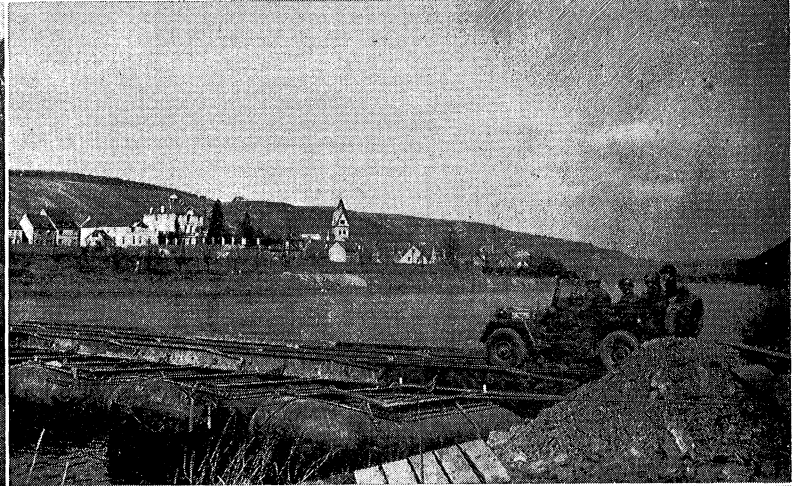

BATTLE OF CENTRAL EUROPE

It was here that we formed those famous task forces. Three or four tanks, a tank destroyer, a squad of proven engineers, and a company of doughboys made up the fighting team. It was our

job to keep those tanks rolling at all costs. Trees felled across the roads, craters and mines were our most annoying obstacles. Let me say at this time, stories of German atrocities were not in the least exaggerated. We witnessed Buchenwald in all its

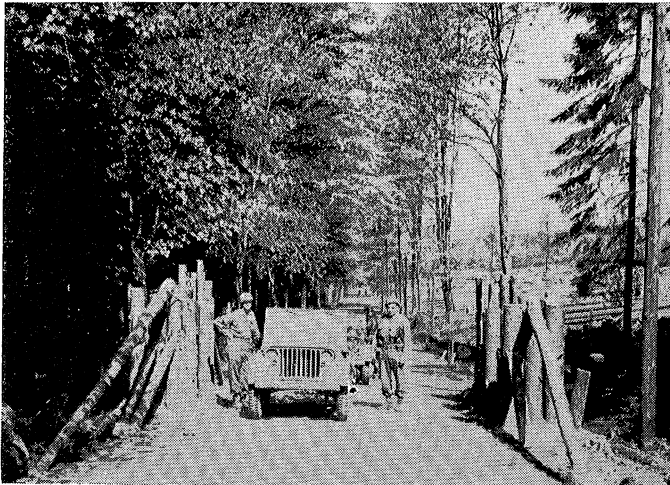
Engineers clearing Abatis for Patton's tanks in the Battle of Central Europe.

horrible reality. Ovens for burning human remains, torture chambers, and other brutal instruments of death were common. Remains of what once were citizens of Europe were in evidence. The sights sickened our stomachs and fired our fury to do the job of finishing Jerry for all time. Our tanks were slowed down, but never stopped. Large cities such as Rudolstadt, Possneck, Plauen, and many others were captured in the onrush of men and steel. It was in these cities that chocolate bars and cigarettes would buy anything and we "mean anything." There was one time during this drive that we hastily erected a bridge to replace the one Jerry had blown. The tankers were skeptical as to its strength as we had broken all speed records in its erection. To prove our work, we placed a sign at the abutment which read, "Come on Yank, it will hold your tank." The mystery of it was that it did, too! We were approaching the Russians

after a record breaking dash across Germany into Czechoslovakia, and Jerry was reeling from blows struck from two sides. We had won the War! Yes, we looted, drank wine from the Moselle and Rhine valleys, raced madly for the nearest burgomeister's house to gather cameras, swords, etc., before someone beat us to the prize, and captured smiles from the pretty frauleins. We did all of this—This was Yank custom and humor, the customs and humor which pretty well dominate the world today. No one can fully appreciate the part we played in this biggest of shows but the infantry. It was on one of those no-man's-land missions we had received that a "dough" was overheard to say, "Be one of those crazy engineers—Nuts! I'd take a platoon of Jerries before I would take out one of those mine contraptions!"

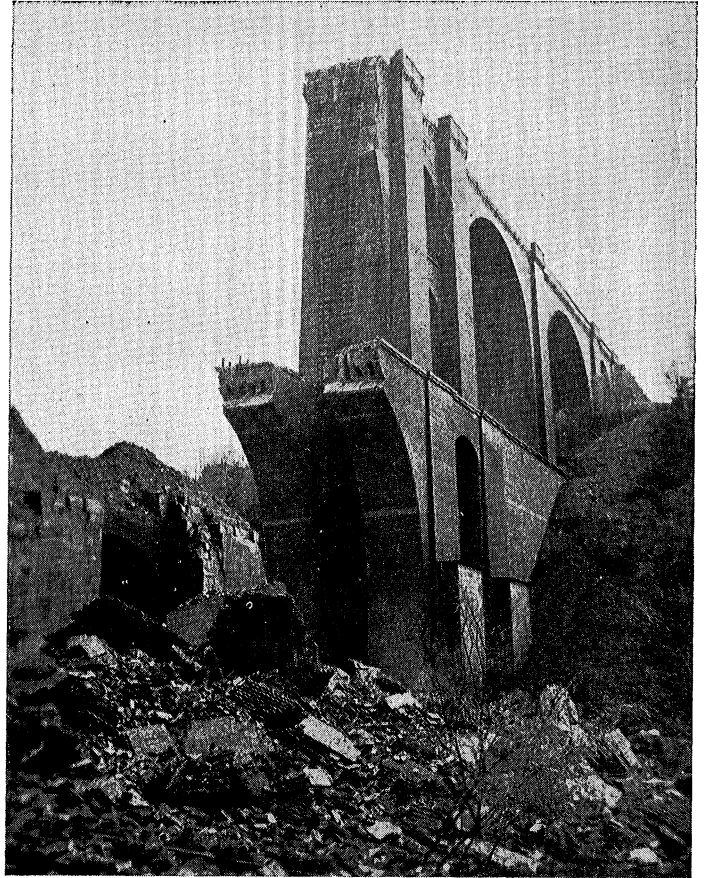
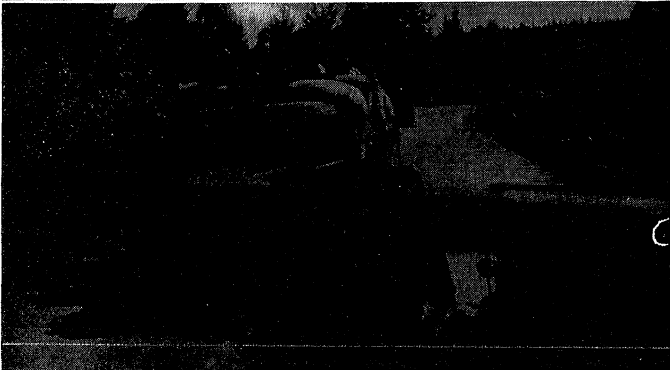
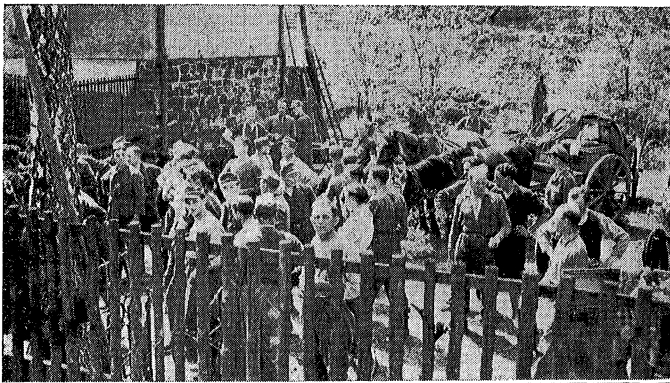

claimed, we battled non-fraternization and close order drill. Then, we were shipped to Oklahoma City near Rheims, France to await redeployment to Pacific via the good old United States. We did get to Paris from this camp and enjoyed the trip. Blackmarket, Mademoiselles, sleek Frenchmen, and gay sidewalk cafes were in abundance here. The war had little effect on Paris' beauty and it leaves memories that will last the rest of our lives. We all agree on this one way or the other!

Yes, we even had beer.

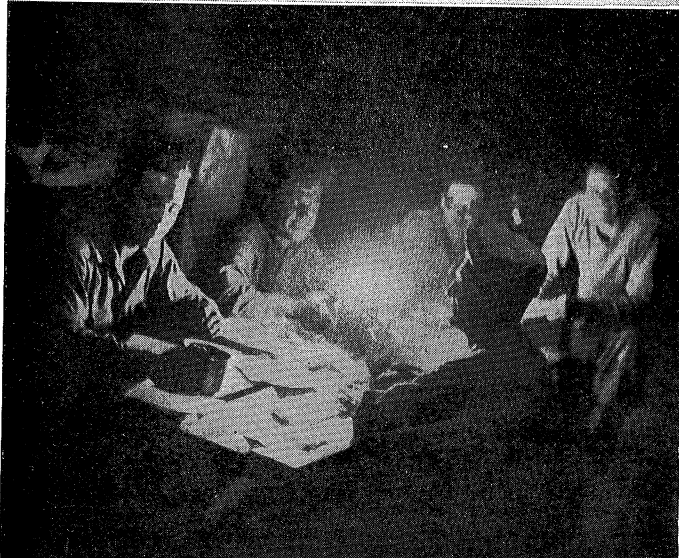

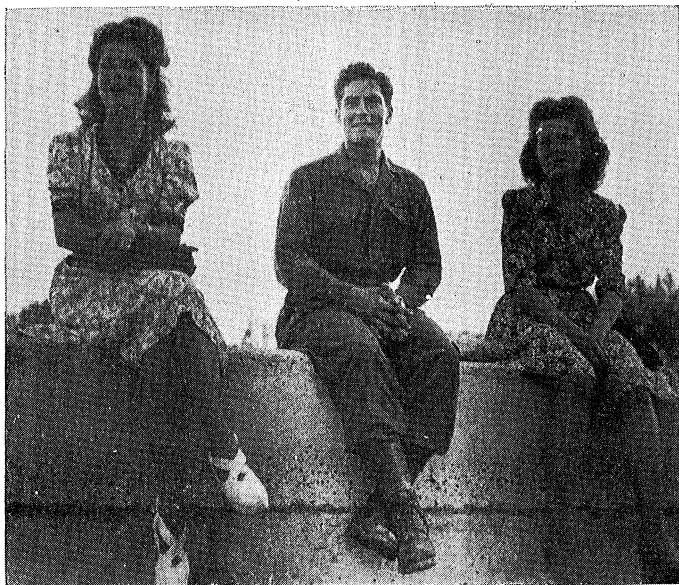


MEDICAL DETACHMENT
