rolled into Denver Friday night from Fort Meade, S. D., bearing the brave colors of the old First cavalry, which fought many battles in the winning of the west. The reconnaissance squadron of the Fourth cavalry, mechanized, formerly the First cavalry, no longer rides the mustangs of the early days but rides and fights from heavily armored, hard-shooting arsenals on wheels. 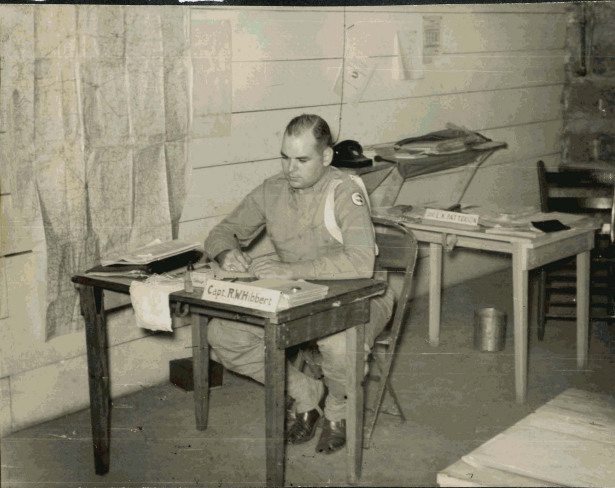
